
The present edition is the last publication prepared in the framework of the organisation of the administrative services of the University of Coimbra which prevailed since the beginning of the publication of "UC - Facts and Figures". As a result of the UC statutes approved in 2008, an important restructuring of the University as a whole is taking place by the time this edition is made available.

The restructuring pursues many objectives, of which only a few are relevant for the present context: the UC is organising itself towards a higher coherence and interoperability of its information systems, seeking more effective procedures for data gathering and information processing.

Considering this turning point, as in any other, the past must be taken into account when planning the future. In this context, it is imperative to acknowledge that, working with not too adequate structures for the purpose, the workers involved in the preparation of "UC - Facts and Figures" did it with high professionalism and dedication. Recognizing this in its true dimension is actually only possible to those who, as I, have the perception of the difficulty, prevailing up to now, of compiling information and producing reliable indicators. The diversity of information sources and the concern on providing coherence to the results exposed implied always a great number of working hours in researching, organising and processing information, followed by countless iterations of tables' revision. As the present structure hasn't been the most appropriate nor focused on this type of activity, the pressure of the remaining tasks, always claiming for urgent attention and action, add more value to the achieved work.

These aspects have to be stressed because they were essential to the success of the effort the University of Coimbra invested in order to fulfil its obligation of accountability, as a public body with a mission of public service. They are as well essential to fulfilling this goal, combining less effort and higher pace in the future.

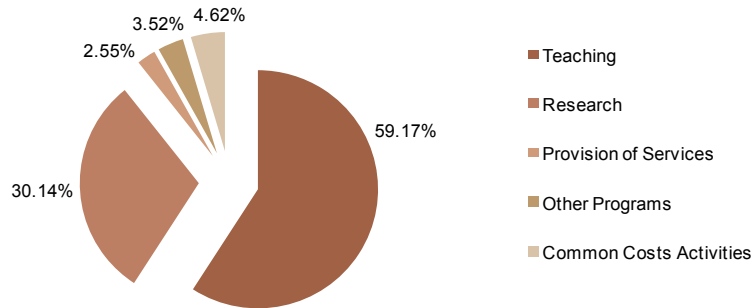

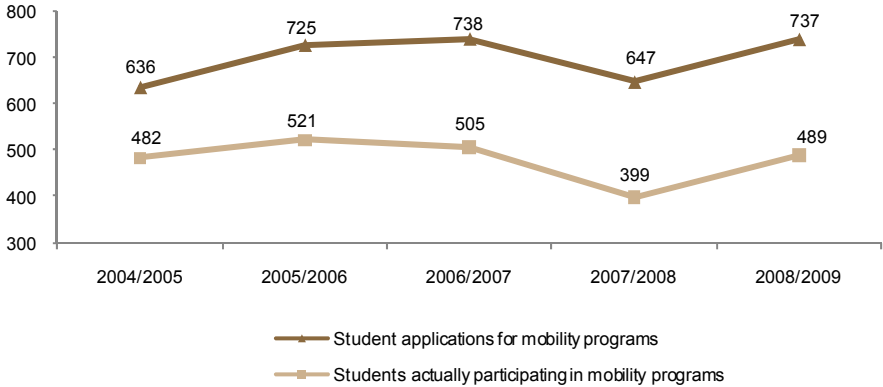

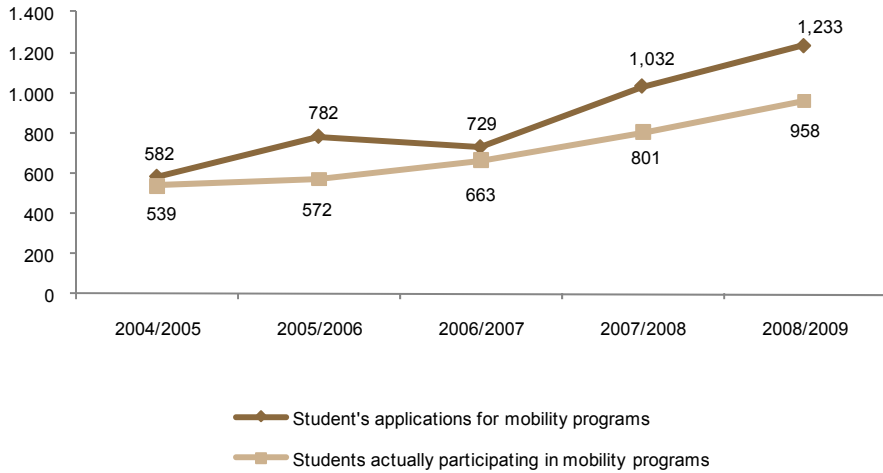

- G3 – Number of applications and participating students in mobility programs - Incoming

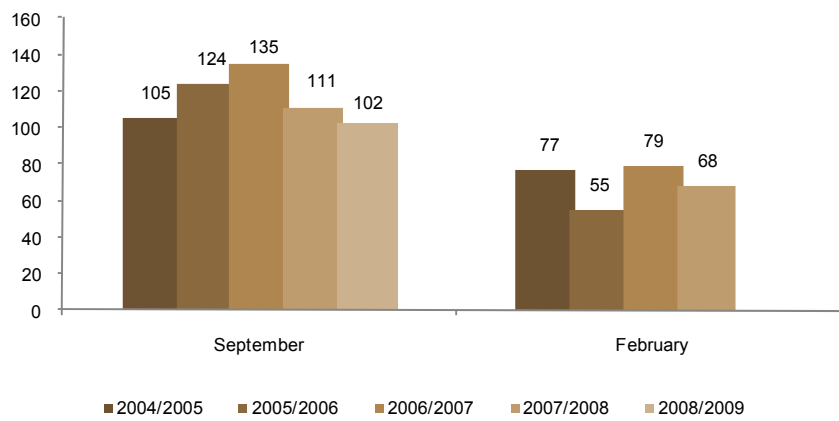

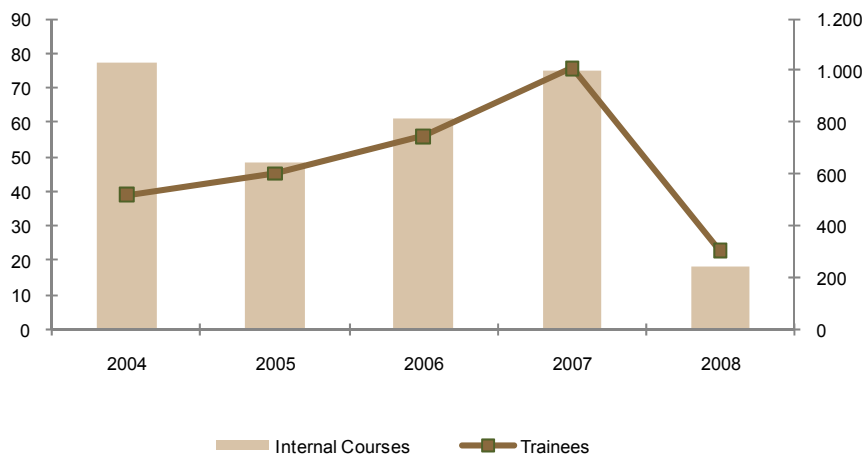

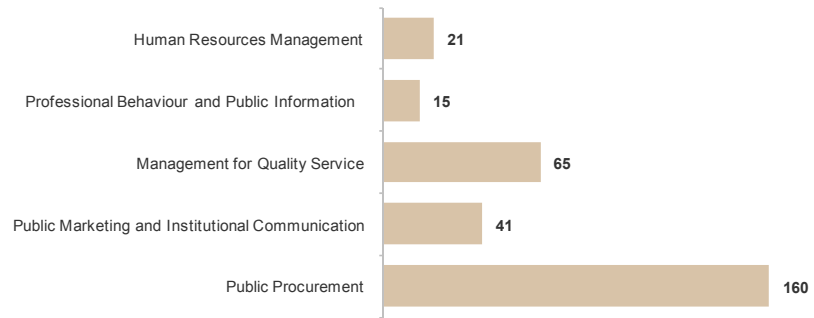

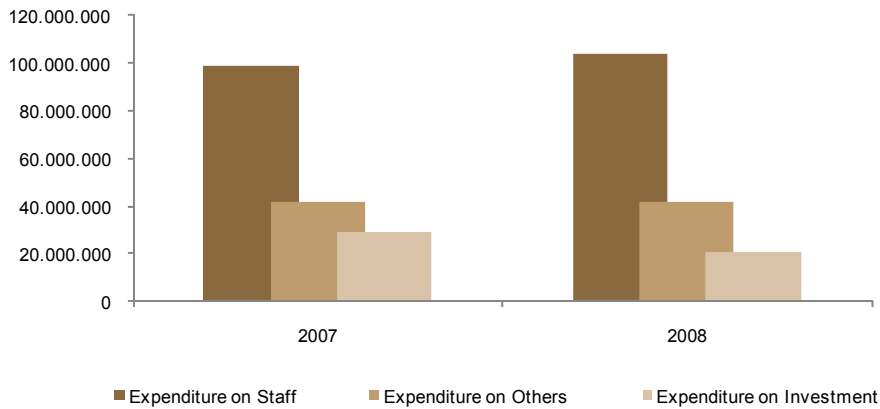

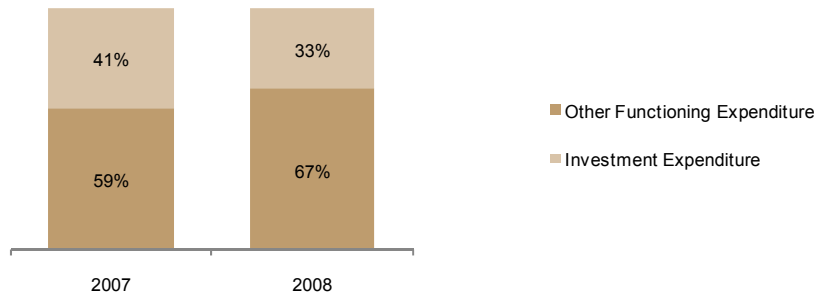
- T22, G8 – Application of Funds

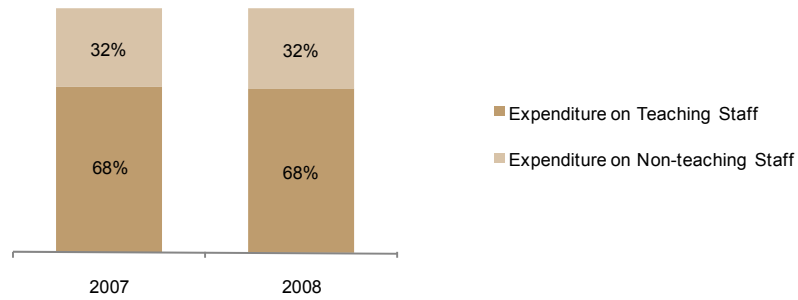
- G9 – Development of the Application of Funds

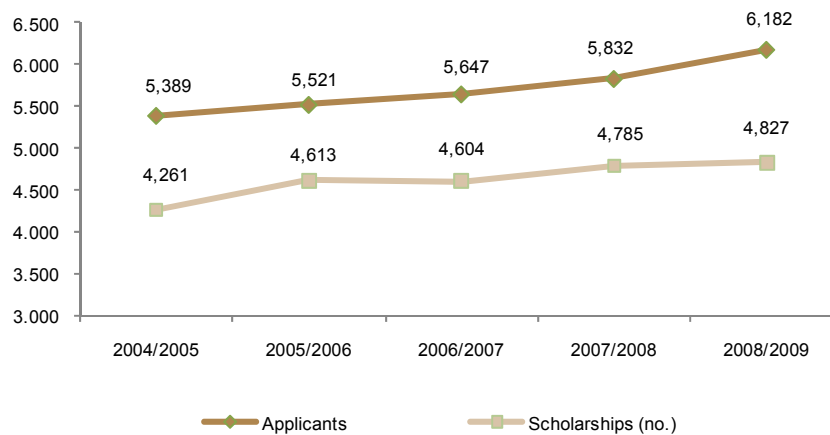

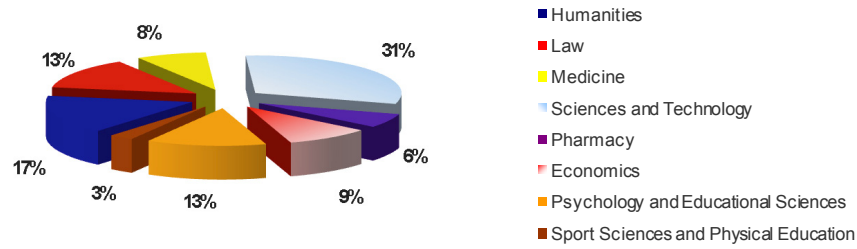

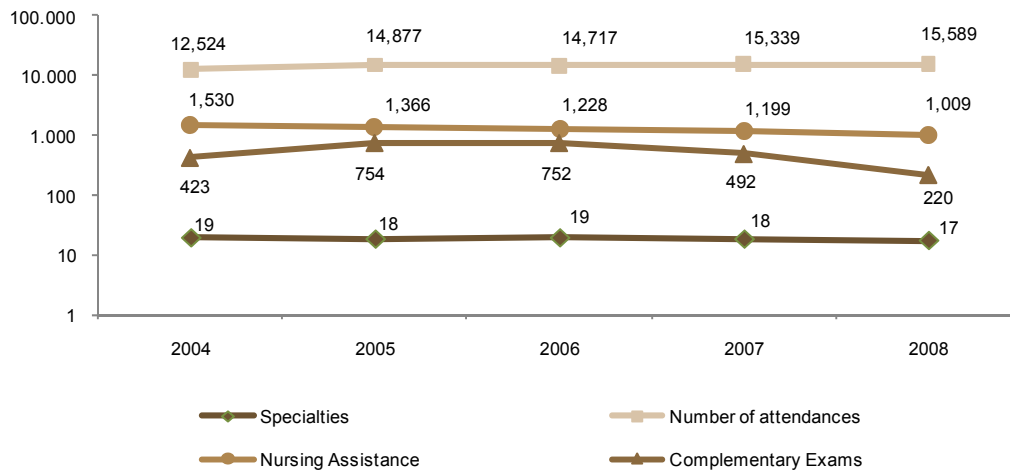
