Coimbra Architecture Summer Atelier is an intensive workshop organized by the Department of Architecture of the University of Coimbra, Portugal. Combining practical and theoretical modules, CASA proposes to investigate the built environment from an architectural, urban and social perspective, taking Coimbra as a contemporary artefact of reflection and intervention.

Immersed in an atelier environment under tutor guidance, students and young professionals are challenged to develop design strategies that address proposed cyclical concept themes. A theoretical component is added to this programme through informal sessions and debates, where concepts, ideas and projects are discussed so as to stimulate the design process.

CASA provides a *forum* for architectural experiment, the lively exchange of ideas, sharing of knowledge and promoting of a cultural space. Participants will find here a dynamic and interdisciplinary space for interaction with dedicated professionals of contemporary architectural practice, as well as renowned academics committed to teaching and research in this field.

Embracing diverse nationalities, cultures and learning processes, CASA intends to promote the exchange of practices, experiences, and ideas across generations, having as its main goal the creation of innovative design proposals for Coimbra.

COIMBRAIphaville

designing from dystopia

In 2025 it will be 60 years since the auspicious premiere of 'Alphaville', a film by Jean-Luc Godard that became one of the symbols of the Nouvelle Vague, the french movement that revolutionized the European cinema in the 1960s and 1970s. In the film, as in the movement itself, there's a scathing critique of the modern, technological and motorised civilization built and glorified since the II post-war, and consequently of the functionalist urbanism and the ex-novo architectures that then spread across various suburbs. The same theme would reappear in other works by François Truffaut — 'Fahrenheit 451' (1966) — or Jacques Tati — 'Playtime' (1967) and 'Trafic' (1971). Godard's film is, in fact, a disenchanted portrait of a modern utopia transformed into an urban dystopia, where women and men are subjugated by the perverse power of an artificial intelligence of their own invention. 'Alphaville' portrays a dark, tense, misogynistic, almost post-human and eminently motorised environment, where collective space is transformed into a technocratic, zoned, privatised, 'algorithmized' enclosure — after all, not too distant from today's world.

In the 1960s, Coimbra was also living its modern utopia, previously outlined in the plans of Étienne de Groer (1940) and Antão de Almeida Garrett (1955), supported by good demographic and motorization indexes, and materialized by the construction of new residential neighborhoods, initiated after the extensive demolition of the "Alta" (Uptown) area, and the migration of its inhabitants to the new suburbs: Vale do Calhabé, Montes Claros and Conchada. These were also the places where a "new wave" of architects – Alberto Pessoa, Carlos de Almeida, Manuel Teles,

Jorge Albuquerque, Rogério Alvarez and Vasco Cunha -together with many other engineers - António Barata Portugal, Carlos Mendes Veloso, Rui Castro Pita and José Luís Azevedo — were able to dream up the modern city that was overdue, around the old traditional center. Over the course of that and the following decades, Coimbra saw the dispersed growth of new urban axes, apartment blocks and towers, surrounded by interstitial spaces, many of which provided access to underground and ground floors for the automobile – the modern family's device for bourgeois emancipation. But even then, the so-called *Cinema Novo* — the Portuguese version of the Nouvelle Vague — denounced the phenomenon of suburbanization (of Lisbon), as in Paulo Rocha's film 'Os Verdes Anos', released in 1963, curiously two years before Godard's film.

More than half a century after the creation of this modern Coimbra, many of the valuable utopian and emancipatory architectures of the time are now surrounded by uncharacteristic spaces, arbitrarily crowded with cars or privatized by condominiums and residents; in other words, this modern city has become a kind of COIMBRAlphaville. Just when the city is about to inaugurate a new peri-urban public transport system — MetroMondego — and is also betting on soft mobility, when teleworking and online commerce are changing commuting patterns — utopia for some, dystopia for others — it might be interesting to (re) design this post-motorized city, taking advantage of the urban and architectural interstices left by the hypothetical disappearance of the private car. It's not a political program against the car — which can become a sustainable and shareable device - or even the use of new technologies — which should serve us and not subjugate us; it's simply a question of qualifying the space shared by residents and visitors, the neighborhood facilities and the local commerce, generating new

forms of collaborative habitat by 'occupying' the zoned and privatized spaces of the city. Ultimately, it's about designing a possible future from that *COIMBRAlphaville*.

Thus, with the research project 'Coimbra Nouvelle Vague' on the horizon, the theme 'COIMBRAIphaville, designing from dystopia' is launched as the leitmotif of the CASA 2025 workshop. It will be organized around four fronts of analysis and proposal, to be tackled by as many groups of tutors and students. These are: (1) the Norton de Matos neighborhood, on the fronts adjacent to the 'Caixas de Previdência' buildings; (2) the Solum neighborhood, South front; (3) the Solum neighborhood, North front; (4) the Fernão Magalhães Avenue, West front. On these fronts, and based on an analysis of the plans and sections of the underground, ground and standard floors of the respective neighborhoods, the four teams will be asked to design a more cohesive, porous and humanist city, creating new opportunities for relationships between residents and collective spaces. To do this, and without distorting the architectural authorship that defines these neighborhoods, the teams will be asked to find new ways to re-naturalize the current car parks and to establish urban and architectural links between the underground floors (where they exist) and the ground floors, transforming them into spaces for new cohousing, urban facilities and recreational uses.

Ultimately, this workshop is about giving the city back to the citizens.

Where will the workshop take place?

In which language will the workshop be held?

Both the workshops and sessions will be held in english. CASA team does not require participants to present a language certificate, however, we strongly recommend a good level of fluency.

Are there any speficic requirements for participation?

CASA mainly aims to architecture and urban planning students or recent graduates.

A strong command of both hand drawing and computer drawing skills is advised.

Do I need to bring my laptop?

Each participant should bring their own laptop. Drawing paper, cutting tools, rulers and other supplies will be provided. Nevertheless, we encourage each participant to bring their own drawing materials, such as pencils, pens and others.

Will I be granted a diploma/certificate of participation?
